Dear Mr. Pichai, Mr. Alegre, and Mr. Fernández:

As Members of the Congressional Hispanic Caucus, we write with concerns we have been hearing from our constituents regarding the status of the ongoing carriage negotiations between your three organizations. While these are separate matters—between TelevisaUnivision and YouTube TV, and between NBCUniversal/Telemundo and YouTube TV—their outcome will directly affect whether millions of households retain consistent access to Spanish-language programming after September 30, 2025.

For decades, Univision and Telemundo have provided news, entertainment, and cultural programming to viewers across the country. This programming not only informs audiences with daily local and national news, weather updates, and emergency information, but also reflects the cultural heritage and identity of Spanish-speaking households.

It is important to recognize that Spanish-language programming serves a wide range of households—many of which look to these networks as a primary source of information. While families could seek other options, the sudden disruption of such longstanding access could create challenges for viewers at a time when trusted reporting and diverse representation remain especially important.

As YouTube TV continues to grow—potentially becoming the largest distributor in the United States as soon as 2026—its platform plays a central role in ensuring audiences nationwide remain connected to the content they value. TelevisaUnivision and NBCUniversal likewise have a long history of investing in Spanish-language programming that has become essential to communities across the country.

As Members of the Congressional Hispanic Caucus, we encourage all parties to engage in good faith negotiations and come to a beneficial agreement soon. Finally, we respectfully request any information on how your companies plan to address the ongoing dispute as we continue to evaluate legislative considerations regarding access to Spanish-language media. Thank you for your consideration.
